# Commercial Air, Inc. Found Guilty of Violating Federal Labor Law

Indianapolis, April 8, 2015: The National Labor Relations Board has found that Commercial Air, Inc. violated Federal Labor Law. The National Labor Relations Board is a Federal Agency of the United States Government.

The charges, filed by the Indiana State Pipe Trades Association, have been under investigation by the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) since March 2013 and involved allegations of violations of federal labor law.

Commercial Air, Inc., a Lebanon, Indiana-based contractor, performs work for public schools, colleges, and other public entities throughout Central Indiana.

Indiana State Pipe Trades Association Organizer John Kurek stated, *“Under federal law, employees are free to learn about the benefits of belonging to a union without the fear of interference, intimidation, or retaliation from their employer.”*
