National Labor Relations Board Issues Consolidated Complaint on Nine Charges Against Midwest Constructors, LLC

Hearing Scheduled for December 15 in Indianapolis

Indianapolis, October 8, 2015: The National Labor Relations Board (NLRB), the federal agency investigating alleged multiple violations of federal labor law by Midwest Constructors, LLC has issued an order consolidating all nine (9) cases into a single consolidated complaint and scheduled a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge beginning December 15 at the Minton-Capehart Federal Building in Indianapolis.

Among the numerous allegations itemized in the seven (7) page order issued by the NLRB are allegations that members of Midwest management violated federal labor law by engaging in the following activities:

- > threatened applicants for employment with arrest because of their Union membership and activity;
- > instructed applicants for employment to leave Respondent's facility because of their Union membership and activity;
- > took photographs of applicants for employment because of their Union membership and activity;
- > refused to allow applicants for employment to apply for employment with Respondent because of their Union membership and activity;
- > attempted to obstruct employees from speaking to representatives of the Union;
- > instructed employees not to speak to representatives of the Union.

Due to the number and nature of the charges, the hearing could last several days.

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
